Two-stroke gas engines	But, there is little doubt that municipalities may regulate the use of power tools pursuant to their so-called police power, that is, their authority to enact ordinances that promote public health and safety. In 2011, <a href="#">Edmunds</a> , the car reviewer, compared a two-stroke-engine leaf blower with a Ford F-150 Raptor pickup truck, finding that a half-hour of yard work produced the same amount of hydrocarbon emissions as a 3,887-mile drive in the truck.
