Walnut Street Corridor Plan Wrapping Up



The city received funding from the La Crosse Area Planning Committee (LAPC) Local Studies Program to create a corridor plan for Walnut Street. The LAPC is the regional Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the La Crescent/La Crosse Bi-state transportation planning area. The purpose of the planning effort was to re-imagine the corridor into a walkable/bikeable complete street that meets the needs of downtown businesses, community residents, and visitors. The city identified in its 2017 Downtown Plan, a vision of the downtown as a trailhead to a regional system of interconnected walking, biking, hiking trails in the community including the blufflands, streets, and waterways.

The city's Economic Development commission served as the project planning committee. The planning process has involved extensive input from the downtown businesses, residential property owners along the corridor, the hotel, tavern, and the event center. The project includes water, sewer, stormwater management,

pavement replacement, streetscaping, and wayfinding elements. The city is working with MSA Professional Services on the planning study. The plan will assist the city in the final engineering design for the reconstruction of Walnut Street from South 3rd Street to North 4th Street and to Veterans Park. The Economic Development Commission, City Planning Commission, and City Council will review and finalize the plan in October and November.

Fall Leaves and Winter Snow

As summer comes to a close and we slide into fall please keep in mind the following when it comes to leaves and snow:

- Please do not rake your leaves into the street this leads to clogging of the storm drains.
- Trees must be kept trimmed at an 8' clearance above any sidewalk and a 13'6" minimum height clearance from the edge of the road.
- · Snow must be cleared from sidewalks within 24 hours after the end of the snowfall.



La Crescent Becoming a Heart Safe Community

Over the past six months, the City of La Crescent has created a team to focus on making La Crescent a Heart Safe Community. Heart Safe designation is awarded by the State of Minnesota through the Minnesota Department of Health and indicates a team is working to improve education and access to emergency care which needs to be provided as soon as possible when witnessing an event. This means that we not only need prepared and equipped police, first responders, fire fighters, and EMS teams, but also that we all need to be ready to respond quickly in the event of a cardiac arrest. Did you know that for every one minute of cardiac arrest, a person's chance of survival decreases by 10%? Depending on where an event happens in a more rural setting like La Crescent, it could take 4 minutes or more until arrival of emergency responders, so getting started immediately by prepared and trained police and bystanders is vital!

The Heart Safe team has representatives from the city of La Crescent, Fire and Police Departments, the La Crescent Community Foundation, the Rotary, the Lions, the Chamber of Commerce, La Crescent-Hokah Schools, Gundersen-Tristate and 7R Cardiac Arrest Preparedness and Education team.

Some things the team has accomplished to date are:

- Applied for and received a state grant to obtain six AED's for our police officers vehicles
- Completed and submitted a pending application for Heart Safe status to the MN Department of Health.
- Located multiple AED's within the city and township of La Crescent and registered them on the free "Pulse Point' app.
- Collaborated to develop a "loaner" AED program through the police department, supported by 7 Rivers CAPE and the Community Foundation.
- Provided private trainings at local non-profits and businesses
- Developed a work plan for the next two years

Keeping our Storm Sewers Clean: What is an Illicit Discharge?

Anything that goes into the storm sewer system that is not storm water is

considered an illicit discharge including but not limited to: paint, grass clippings and leaves, pet waste, motor oils, lawn chemicals, and sidewalk deicers.

How do I Report an illicit discharge?

Step 1. Observe from a safe distance. DO NOT touch or smell the substance.

Step 2. Notify the Non-Emergency Police Dispatch 507-895-4414 (Available 24/7). In case of an emergency, call 911.

Step 3. Provide the following information: your name, phone number, discovery/incident time, date, and location, description of material, and source if known, estimated extent of the problem, take photographs of the scene and send them to:

City Prairie Plantings

You may have noticed several areas of prairie plantings around La Crescent. City of La Crescent Sustainability Coordinator Jason Ludwigson explains that the City has been looking at areas within the city that are not frequently used by the public for the plantings such as storm water drainage areas and steep hillsides. The plantings enhance habitat for birds, bees, and butterflies as well as help to capture storm water, thus reducing runoff. Also, with the reduction in mowing, the city captures cost savings and improves safety for city work crews since the slopes are both difficult and dangerous to mow. Prairie plantings take several years to fully establish. In 2016, Vetsch Park became the first site to be planted, which was completed by the City in partnership with Pheasants Forever, who



contributed the funds to purchase the seed. In 2022 a prairie planting was established behind the Kwik Trip on North 4th Street as well as at the trailhead to Eagles Bluff Park located on Red Apple Street. By 2024, there will be approximately 14 acres converted from turf grass to prairie planting in the City of La Crescent.
